


**State Center City Council
Special Meeting Minutes
March 31, 2026, 5:47 p.m.**

State Center City Council met in special session on March 31, 2026, in the City Hall Council Room. Mayor Pfantz called the meeting to order. Roll Call: Darrow, German, Latimer, Quick and Schoppe. Also present were L. Bearden, Jesse Toyne, and B. Pfantz.

- Motion by German, 2nd by Darrow to approve the agenda. Motion passes 5-0.
- Darrow moved to adopt Res. 26-54 setting a public hearing to hear comments regarding the proposed FY27 Budget for April 21st at 5:30 p.m. at the State Center City Hall. German 2nd, Res. 26-54 is adopted 5-0 roll call.
- Darrow moved to adopt Res. 26-53 approving pay application #1 to Keystone Construction Services in amount of \$61,591.12. Quick 2nd, Res. 26-53 is adopted 5-0 roll call.
- Quick moved to adopt Res. 26-55 approving transfer of \$85,000.00 from the State Center Area Foundation bank account to the Fire Station Renovation and Addition Project Fund in the General bank account. Darrow 2nd. There was discussion of the spreadsheet the clerk provided council tracking all costs to date of the fire station project. There was additional discussion of plans to close on the Central State Bank loan for the project, that date being April 29, 2026. Res. 26-55 is adopted 5-0 roll call.
- There was discussion regarding replacing the roof of the current fire station structure to match what will be put on the new addition of the project. Bearden reported that an updated quote has not been received as of this meeting. There was discussion on how old the current roof is and if there is still existing warranty on it. The clerk will attempt to locate this information.
- There was no discussion of a budget amendment.
- The mayor led discussion of the unplanned closing of Main Street between the Fire Station project site, city hall and the grocery store. The location of the current sewer main required closure of the whole width of the street and is estimated to be closed thru April 10th. It was originally expected that only the north half of the street would be closed.

There being no further business, Darrow moved to adjourn at 6:15 p.m. Hearing no objection, Mayor Pfantz closed the meeting.
