## State Center City Council Regular Meeting Minutes October 16, 2019

State Center City Council met in regular session on Wednesday, October 16, 2019 in the City Hall Council Room. Mayor Sodders called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll Call: Mayor Sodders, Councilors: Bunn, Darrow, Nichols, Shaffar and Wilkinson. Absent: None. Others Present: Jon Thomas, Jeff Robinson, Zach Faught, Mike Kielly, Kristi Yates, Brad Pfantz, Chris Davis, Nick Frederickson, Matt & Jennifer Jensen, Conner Faught, Conner Bockes, Courtney Sisson, Jim Eckhardt, Diane Eckhardt, Bob Ranson, Michael LeClere, Dick Postel, Leigh Bauder, Jacob Weuve and Lori Bearden.

- Mayor Sodders opened the public hearing to hear comments on the proposed sale of Figgins 2, Lot 6 to K&K Builders for \$10,000.00. Bob Ranson addressed the council with remarks regarding the current storm water flow issues in this area and the increased problems that raising Lot 6 to put a home on the lot might create with flooding adjoining properties. He provided photocopies of flooding caused by snow melt. A second point Ranson made was that he did not believe that lot should be built on but if it was suitable for building that the lot should be sold for the price everyone else paid for their lots. Another issue brought up was the flooding that occurs running north/south in his backyard that is west across the street from Lot 6. Questions regarding tiling changes/improvements were raised. Diane Eckhardt informed the council that she has had to dig out the frozen culvert to allow water to flow away from her lot. There was much discussion regarding how flooding in both locations could be corrected. Mayor Sodders closed the public hearing at 7:18 p.m.
- Motion by Bunn, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Shaffar to approve the consent agenda. Motion passes 5-0.
- Motion by Wilkinson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Shaffar to table the sale of Figgins2 Lot 6 until the lot could be evaluated by ISG engineers. ISG will offer an opinion prior to the November 20<sup>th</sup> council meeting. Motion to table passes 5-0 roll call. A public work committee meeting is set for Wednesday, November 13<sup>th</sup>, 6 p.m. All of council is encouraged to attend further discuss the flooding stormwater and resolution to the problem.
- Mayor Sodders recognized Michael LeClere with Martin Gardner Architecture. Mr. LeClere spoke of services his employer can offer small communities including grant searching and applications.
- Wilkinson introduced and moved to adopt resolution 20-08 approving the City of State Center's continued support of State Center Development Association's work with Main Street Iowa. Nichols 2<sup>nd</sup>; Res. 20-08 is adopted 5-0 roll call.
- Darrow introduced and moved to adopt Res. 20-06 approving the FY19 Annual Financial Report as presented. Bunn 2<sup>nd</sup>; Res. 20-06 is adopted 5-0 roll call.
- Courtney Sisson addressed the council regarding 6 apple trees she planted on the north side of her property not knowing that apple trees are prohibited in the City right-of-way and not knowing she needed to have a permit. The public works committee earlier indicated to Zach Faught that she would need to remove the trees. Courtney feels she is being singled out and believes other properties in town have prohibited tree varieties in the right-of-way. Mayor Sodders had a resource for determining if the trees can be moved. Once there is a decision on moving the trees the council will revisit the issue with a final determination. Courtney wants the council to address any other trees in violation in the same manner as her trees are. The clerk's office will prepare a notice to go out with utility bills so that property owners are aware of the ordinance. We will add this topic to the public works committee agenda for the 13th.
- Leigh Bauder presented the council with options for the City's employee health insurance. The plan the City currently uses is being dropped. She is looking at a best comparable Wellmark option and a National General option. The employees will all fill out applications so that we can get firm costs for coverage. A personnel committee meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 29, 7:30 p.m. to look more closely at the options.
- Shaffar introduced and moved to adopt resolution 20-09 approving of monthly transfers. Darrow 2<sup>nd</sup>;
   Res. 20-09 is adopted 5-0 roll call.

- The clerk discussed a partial alley that was vacated by the City in 1952 but only 1 (in 1976) of 6 abutting property owners had a quit claim deed recorded (it would have been the property owners' responsibility to have it recorded. The clerk and city attorney will do what they can to get the remaining 5 deeds processed by the property owners.
- The council revisited Chapter 41 of the Code of Ordinances. A proposed amendment draft will shorten allowed dates and times to: 1) Friday and Saturday of Rose Festival from 2 to 10 p.m. and 2) a maximum of four days, including the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday, set by resolution and published annually in May by the State Center City Council, from 2 to 10 p.m. The first reading of the amendment will be at the November 20<sup>th</sup> council meeting.
- Mike Kielly reviewed the planned street projects starting in 2020. The original plan of several alternates may not be in the City's best interest. The proposed contracts with ISG for 4<sup>th</sup> St. and E Main St. will be revisited after the Public Works committee on November 13<sup>th</sup>.
- Motion by Bunn, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Darrow to approve the purchase of a 2012 Tahoe from the State of Iowa DOT, with 90,000 miles. Motion approved 4-0 with Wilkinson abstaining, he is an IDOT employee.
- Motion by Darrow, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Nichols to accept a \$4,200.00 grant from Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau for equipment and overtime wages. Motion passes 5-0.
- Motion and second by recommendation of the public safety committee to set the part-time police officer wage at \$20.00/hour. Motion passes 5-0.
- The Keltic invoice will be held until Chief Thomas has clarified the bill.
- Chief Thomas will be putting together a plan for adding car/body cameras.
- Mayor Sodders stated that the Waltemeyer property is being negotiated on with the SCDA.
- Wilkinson asked if changing the council meeting night would be possible; he is frequently having a conflict with Wednesday. The third Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. was agreed upon. The clerk will take steps to amend the ordinance. \*\*
- There being no further business, motion by Wilkinson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Darrow to adjourn at 8:40 p.m. Motion passes 5-0.
