## State Center City Council Regular Meeting Minutes August 18, 2020

State Center City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, August 18, 2020 at the City Hall Community Room. There were none present via Zoom. Mayor Sodders called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance. Councilors Darrow, Nichols, Wilkinson and Quick were present. Absent was Shaffar and Kevin O'Hare. Others present were Jeff Robinson, Zach Faught, Jon Thomas, Kristi Yates, Brad Pfantz, Chris Davis, Nick Frederickson, Garret Jacobs, Matt & Jennifer, Mike & Diane Eckhardt, Bob Ranson and Paul Deneui.

- Motion by Wilkinson to approve consent agenda. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Darrow, motion passes 4-0.
- At this point Public Works plans to pick up brush storm debris from curbs through July 31<sup>st</sup>. The brush dump will be open for at least 30 more days.
- At 6:42 p.m. there was a motion by Quick, 2nd by Nichols to enter closed session pursuant to Iowa Code 21.5(1)j to discuss the sale of particular real estate only where premature disclosure could be reasonably expected to reduce the price the governmental body would receive for that property. Motion passes 4-0 roll call.
- All left the meeting except for mayor, council, and clerk.
- At 7:01 p.m. the was motion by Wilkinson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Darrow to re-enter open session. All listed in attendance above returned to the meeting. Motion by Darrow, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Nichols to have the clerk deliver a counteroffer to the interested party. Motion passes 3-1 roll call with Wilkinson voting Nay.
- Brad reported that the Fire/EMS building project final specs were almost complete and then a cost estimate could be produced.
- Annexation topic was tabled as Kevin O'Hare was not present. The Library code and approval of the new Code of Ordinances was tabled also for the same reason.
- Garret Jacobs with CGA presented a draft of plans for drainage in West Figgins that would use a buried culvert rather than the previously presented 2-stage ditch concept as requested last month. The preliminary cost on the culvert concept would be \$350,000.00, much higher than the previously proposed concept which had an estimated cost of \$139,000.00. The topic will be reviewed at the September meeting. It is likely too late in the season to be able to complete either design yet this construction season.
- Nick Frederickson updated the council regarding the lagoon upgrade.
- Darrow introduced and moved to adopt Res. 21-03 setting a date for a public hearing on proposal to enter into a sewer revenue note for planning & design of the lagoon project in amount of #370,000.00. Wilkinson 2<sup>nd</sup>; Res. 21-03 is adopted 4-0 roll call.
- Nick Frederickson updated the council regarding the water treatment plant.
- Quick introduced and moved to adopt Res. 21-04 approving of monthly fund transfers totaling \$25,735.89. Nichols 2<sup>nd</sup>; Res. 21-04 is adopted 4-0 roll call.
- Motion by Wilkinson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Darrow to pay claim to Iowa Codification in amount of \$2,225.00. Motion passes 4-0.
- Kristi discussed two policy issues with the council. There is a need for clarification in Policy 3.3(2) When Payable/Late Penalty and in the Solar Billing Policy regarding credit on account vs issuing a check payment. She will prepare these for the September meeting.
- Dain Winterton has resigned from his police officer position. A replacement search has begun.
- At 7:49 p.m. there was motion by Darrow, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Quick to enter into closed session pursuant to Iowa Code 21.5(1) c to discuss strategy in matters that are presently in litigation or where litigation is imminent. Motion passes 4-0 roll call. All left except for the mayor, council, clerk, and police chief.

- At 7:56 p.m. Wilkinson moved to re-enter open session. Darrow 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passes 4-0 roll call. No others rejoined the meeting. There was no action taken after closed session.
- There being no further business, Wilkinson moved to adjourn. Nichols 2<sup>nd</sup>; motion passes 4-0.
